Minutes of the Regular Meeting May 24, 2018

DRAFT

Call Meeting to Order. President Semel called the meeting to order at 5:00 pm.

Public Discussion. Terri Byers reminded the Board that Jason Paulios has been selected by library staff to serve on the search committee if the Board decides toad a staff member. Paulios read a statement about staff representation on the search committee and provided hard copy handouts. Paulios said it was unclear whether the Search Committee would include a voting staff member on the search committee.

Approval of Minutes.

The minutes of the April 26, 2018 Regular Meeting of the Library Board of Trustees were reviewed. A motion to approve the Regular Minutes was made by Freeman and seconded by Paetzold. Motion carried 7/0.

Items for Discussion/Action.

Skype session with Bradbury Miller Associates. Jobeth Bradbury, representing Bradbury Miller Associates (BMA), Skyped into the Board meeting. She outlined their customary process. There will be four site visits; the first is scheduled for July 12-13, 2018. They suggest a series of conversations, with the full Board, the search committee, and a series of staff focus groups that include management and general staff. Bradbury said they like to meet with as many people as possible, including community stakeholders, and perhaps the Friends Foundation Board. Basically, anyone we think it would be important for the consultants to connect with to get a sense for their aspirations for the community and the library and what people would like to see in a new director. Before the visit, they do an electronic survey, and send it to all board members and search committee members. They send a separate survey to all staff. They will craft a position announcement after they leave and then begin the recruiting process. During the first visit they will set the schedule for the actual search. Bradbury suggested a seven to eight-week recruiting period. After the application period closes, the consultants return and

meet with the search committee. Typically there are seven to nine semifinalists from which three to four are selected as finalists to come to Iowa City. During the recruiting and advertising periods, Bradbury Miller does all the intake. Typically, candidates provide a cover letter and resume, and each candidate completes a questionnaire, as well as phone conversations with the consultants. BMA performs what they call "street reconnaissance," on each of the candidates by calling the state librarian or another local library director for a candidate they may not know. The goal is to vet applicants as much as possible so there are no surprises. The recruiting process is methodical and begins with the state of Iowa, where the job announcement is shared with all public library leadership in Iowa. Then recruitment moves to surrounding states and keeps building out so that by the time they are finished, it is a national search. Bradbury anticipates 25-30 candidates. She said Des Moines had 33 qualified candidates apply for their position. They recommend Skype instead of onsite interview during the semifinal candidate interview phase. All finalists are on-site for two days and the final interviews can be structured however we wish. Library and community tours are included at this time. Job offers are contingent on successful background investigation. Paetzold wanted clarification about focus groups. Bradbury recommends 10-15 persons before it gets unwieldy. Kirsch asked how long the meeting would be; Bradbury said 50 minutes with a ten-minute transition between meetings. She said refreshments are helpful. Semel asked what the makeup of other committees has been. Bradbury said there is tremendous pressure on the staff but many search committees include one or two staff members. They have worked with search committees that had only a designated committee, a whole Board search committee, and a couple with community stakeholders on the search committee. She said the number of people on the committee is important. Freeman cannot attend the first meeting and asked if there will be a record of what happens at the July meeting. Bradbury said during those two days, they take notes and provide a full report to share with committee members and the board. There will be two reports; the board survey and the notes of the meetings with staff. Bradbury suggested Freeman might be able to participate by phone.

Policy Review: 806: Meeting Room and Lobby Use. This is a regularly scheduled policy review. Logsden said the primary change to the policy alters the times the meeting rooms are available and is predicated on staff safety. Currently, when we close the building, the Librarian in Charge meets the Maintenance staff person downstairs and clears the Lobby. Paetzold is concerned about staff safety and asked when we extend beyond operating hours. Logsden said we do this most days of the week. Baker thought it was strange that we are open past library closing hours. Clark said people ask questions during a program and have discussion after the session. Beasley asked if there are cameras in the Lobby and if they need to be adjusted. Logsden said the cameras have been updated in the past couple of months so this has been addressed. Logsden has spoken with maintenance staff and they are comfortable with the process in the proposed policy. We try to balance building availability, safety, and availability of staff. Kirsch asked if the senior person typically stays 30 minutes later. Clark said no. Paetzold asked how often there is an assault. Clark said it is quite rare but it cannot be ignored. Paetzold wondered if our liability is increased. Kirsch asked when the restrooms are checked. A motion to approve the policy with the staff recommended changes was made by Freeman and seconded by Kirsch . Motion carried 7/0.

Accept work on project to remodel Computer Lab. This has been moved to the June agenda as there are still a couple of items on the punchlist.

Art Advisory Committee. A motion to appoint the recommended committee members to the Art Advisory Committee was made by Semel and seconded by Baker. Motion carried 7/0.

Website Reader's Advisory. Anne Mangano gave a brief overview of the new staff picks page. It launched on March 6. Staff wanted to make readers advisory more front and center and reduce the time it takes for staff to write blog posts and recommend books. Individual picks by staff members lets the public get to know us a bit better, particularly via the staff profile section. Going forward, we would like to spotlight community members on our lists and have a way for patrons to ask questions. Paetzold noted that the comments section is gone. Semel asked if we can check traffic to the website; we can.

Staff Reports.

Director's Report. Craig is doing well and is eager to get back to work.

Departmental Reports:

Adult Services. The Genealogy lock-in event benefited from the flexibility of the Digital Media Lab (DML). Many people are interested in the scanning equipment. The DML open house is scheduled for Saturday, June 2 from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm.

Community & Access Services. The Bookmobile is coming off its last shift of the spring schedule and will be out of service next week for maintenance and a reset. The summer schedule begins June 4. Extra staff will be sent out to help with Summer Reading Program sign-up and crowd control.

Development Office Report. This Sunday, the Eat out to Read fundraiser is at Red Pepper Grill. McCarthy said there was a fundraising event every single month this year. She also said that donations have gone well this year. The Friends Foundation Board is currently planning monthly events for next year. On June 26, Rock and Read will take place at the Mill, from 5:30 until 8:00 pm. More information will be forthcoming.

Volunteer Recognition Report. Logsden thanked everyone who came to the event. Eileen Robinson was Volunteer of the Year and she received a 1,500 hour award.

Spotlight on the Collection. No comments.

Miscellaneous. No comments.

President's Report. Semel praised Beasley's father for a great presentation. Beasley said his dad was touched by the turnout for the event.

Announcements from Members. Paetzold recommends the Great American Read, both a national campaign and an eight-part series on IPTV to select the most popular novel. There is a top 100 novel list and a synopsis is provided on the show. Mangano said we have a display highlighting the campaign. Two Iowa libraries will be highlighted. Beasley asked for the request by Paulios about staff membership on the Director Search Committee be an agenda item for the next meeting.

Committee Reports.

Foundation Members. No meeting.

Director Search Committee. A meeting will be set up, likely during the week of June 11, to establish focus groups for inclusion at the consultants' July visit.

Communications. None.

Disbursements.

The MasterCard Expenditures for April, 2018 were reviewed. A motion to approve the disbursements for April, 2018 was made by Kirsch and seconded by Ingersoll. Motion carried 7/0.

The Library Board reviews their current report (attached) at the June meeting, and provides input on the accomplishment of goals for FY18 and discusses possible goals for FY19. Staff then drafts a report that will be reviewed and approved at the July meeting.



LIBRARY BOARD OF TRUSTEES

GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES

The Board of Trustees of the Public Library is a semi-autonomous body of nine persons empowered by state law and city ordinance to act as the governing body of the library. The Board's specific list of legal responsibilities includes:

- determining the goals and objectives of the Library in order to plan and carry out library services
- determining and adopting written policies to govern all aspects of the operation of the Library
- preparing an annual budget and having exclusive control of all monies appropriated by the City Council, earned income, service contracts with Johnson County, University Heights, Hills, Lone Tree, or given to the library through gifts, bequests, grants or awards
- employing a competent staff to administer its policies and carry out its programs

The Board is also an arm of City Government with members appointed by the City Council and its principal operating funds approved by the City Council. The Board therefore seeks at all times to work in harmony with City policies in all areas that do not conflict with its statutory powers.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2017

- 1. Successfully advocated for operating funds to support bookmobile service.
- 2. Began bookmobile planning. RFP issued for vehicle. Committed to cooperative relationship with Antelope Lending Library.
- 3. Expanded Digital Johnson County, a cooperative purchasing agreement for electronic resources.
- 4. Offered a nine-month series of programs, Music is the Word, to welcome The University of Iowa School of Music to downtown Iowa City.

- 5. Supported collaboration with area libraries for Summer Reading Programs, including facilitating the joint purchase of new software that will standardize record keeping at Iowa City Public Library, Coralville Public Library, and North Liberty Community Library.
- 6. Welcomed three new Board members.
- 7. Monitored status of State Historical Libraries in Iowa City and Des Moines and advocated expanded resources for services and collections.
- 8. Began implementation of a new strategic plan.
- 9. Supported the Iowa City UNESCO City of Literature; The Iowa City Book Festival, and One Book Two Book.
- 10. Reviewed and updated the following policies:

- 7. Involve more children in the Summer Reading Program.
- 8. Work with the Friends Foundation to celebrate its 25th anniversary.
- 9. Continue to expand Digital Johnson County as opportunities allow.
- 10. Remain informed of any fiscal challenges facing Iowa City and work with the City to mitigate impact on library services.
- 11. Review and update policies as needed.





Library User Survey - Downtown








How often do you receive information about library services from the following sources?



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


How likely are you to recommend ICPL to a friend?






What is your gender?



Children's Services Report

Prepared for the Iowa City Public Library Board of Trustees, June 2018 meeting By Angie Pilkington, Children's Services Coordinator

May and June have been busy months for our department. We kicked May off by visiting local schools to promote the Summer Reading Program. You can check out our fun video at https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=wz16NAEv-Ck. We also had our 2nd STEAM Festival the first week in May. It was not as heavily attended as it was last year, but we received many compliments from teachers and families as they attended the two-day festival. Each child who attended received a book generously donated by the HAVlife of Johnson County Foundation.

Summer Reading

Sumer Reading has officially started! We are off to a great start with more than 2,200 kids and 275 babies signed up in the first two weeks. Our first official kick off to summer was ABC Saturday. It was a beautiful day out and over 700 children and their families came out to enjoy a show on the family stage or to stop at one of the many booths we had coordinated on Clinton Street.

Our first week of in-the-library shows were very well received. We had about 700 kids attend 3 different shows! Again this year to help accommodate the camps who bring in large numbers of campers and those trying to beat the heat, we have programs at 1 pm every weekday for them to attend. Movie Mondays, Game-on Tuesdays, World Wednesdays, Special Thursday programs and Try-It-Out-Fridays. In addition, we have Tweens on Tuesdays and storytimes every day at 10:30. If you ever hear someone say they are bored, send them over to the Children's Room!

After having a conversation with the Iowa City Autism Community Group, we selected 12 of our programs to offer a second time as a Special Access Program. This gives individuals with autism or other neurodiversity an opportunity to attend our popular programs in a smaller, quieter setting. The group has been ecstatic over our willingness to do this and have helped to make sure the events are well attended. The Iowa City Public Library was also named as an Autism-Friendly Business by the Autism Society of Iowa in May.

I want to thank Patty and the Friends Foundation for their hard work and financial contributions for all of our summer programs, prize books, and grand prizes for the Summer Reading Program. We have fabulous prizes to reward the children from these great sponsors: Pizza Ranch, Aspen Leaf, Iowa Children's Museum, Blank Park Zoo, McDonalds, Chili's and Texas Roadhouse. Without their donations, our program would not be as successful as it is! Thank you!!

Preserving the Westgate Collection of Original Children's Book Art for the Next Generation

The Westgate Collection of Original Children's Book Art was donated by nationally known authors and illustrators of children's books, most of which was collected by long-time children's librarian Hazel Westgate. These pieces are hung throughout the Ellen Buchanan Children's Room of the lowa City Public Library. Most of the works are original working drawings which bear printer's indications for use in the production of the book or are illustrations done by the artist specifically for the Library.

Hazel Westgate began working at the Iowa City Public Library in the children's department in 1949, serving the community for almost forty years. Westgate began collecting original art for the Library in 1964, soliciting about 28 pieces to adorn the walls of a new story hour room. Westgate's

contributions to the Library and the children of Iowa City far extend beyond the collection of original children's book art. During her tenure she increased the number of story hours, provided video programming, and developed outreach programming, bringing storytime to city parks and daycare centers. She was an expert in children's literature and shared her love of stories with others. She was skilled in matching a reader to their book, but she also believed libraries were a place of imagination and play. Lolly Eggers, former ICPL director and author of *A Century of Stories: the history of the Iowa City Public Library*,



1896-1997, wrote "Hazel's philosophy that children should be treated like real people—people who will learn faster and more willingly in an informal, comfortable welcoming place—has been the modus operandi in the Library's children's room." She passed away in 1988.

Containing 59 pieces of art, the Westgate Collection includes illustrations from internationally celebrated children's illustrators such as Dr. Seuss, Ezra Jack Keats, Taro Yashima, Charles Schultz, Marcia Brown, and Margaret and H.A. Rey. Works from renowned illustrators with a connection to the Iowa City area, including Cynthia Jabar, Claudia McGehee, Ellie Simmons, and Will Thomson, are also included. Some of the works include texture, three-dimensional elements, and transparency sheets in their creation, while others include inscriptions to the Iowa City Public Library and Hazel Westgate.

After fifty-four years, many items in the collection need simple changes to the frame kit to ensure preservation. We are working with Blick Art Materials to replace all glass with conservation quality, anti-reflective plexi-glass to reduce fading, change the matting and backing to archival versions, and reframe any pieces when needed. One of the pieces in the Westgate Collection, a painting of Petunia the Goose by Roger Duvoisin needed conservation work. The illustration is a variation of the front and back cover art used for Duvoisin's *Petunia*, published in 1950. As tempera on paper, the paint was flaking off. Hopefully our efforts will make this collection available for the next fifty years.

We will celebrate the collection's return to the Children's Room at the Downtown District's October Gallery Walk on October 5th! A digital exhibit will also be available on our website.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY REPORT TO LIBRARY BOARD (June, 2018)

Summertime demand for tech is high

During the summer, between summer camps, festivals, and families looking for cool relief, there are a lot more young people in the building. These days, that means an almost insatiable demand for access to screen time. The children's room typically reduces the session time for its devices from an hour to 30 minutes. They expand access to popular programs like Minecraft. We have also added a few more options this summer but the competition leads to arguments and we also have children now seeking screen time in the adult and teen areas. Still we try to balance access to devices which many parents try to limit with initiatives that encourage exploration and reading like the Summer Reading Program.

Children's Tech Changes

We have made a few improvements to the children's room technology. For circulating iPads, we are trying out a new management tool to make updating the devices and the apps on them easier. We have added two new internet stations the summer time. The four "AWE" early learning stations were replaced in spring and there are new apps on the iPad and on the touch table.

Much of this will be documenting what we do to conform to the PCI compliance requirements for the type of credit card transactions that we accept. There are also some security enhancements that need to be put into place.

June is the American Library Association's GLBT Book Month. The Iowa City Public Library librarians are honoring LGBTQ literature with books for Pride Month. Here are some of our favorite selections for all age groups, to read and celebrate this Pride Month.

Children's Books

"This Day In June," by Gayle E. Pitman is a picture book illustrating a Pride parade. The end matter serves as a primer on LGBT history and culture and explains the references made in the story.

"Prince & Knight," by Daniel Haack tells the story of a prince and a knight-in-shining-armor who find true love in each other's embrace after fighting a dragon together

"I Am Jazz," by Jessica Herthel and Jazz Jennings, is the story of a transgender child who traces her early awareness that she is a girl in spite of male anatomy, and the acceptance she finds through a wise doctor who explains her natural transgender status.

"Star-Crossed," by Barbara Dee tells the story of Mattie, who is cast as Romeo in an eighth-grade play. Mattie is confused to find herself increasingly attracted to Gemma, a new classmate who is playing Juliet.

Books for Teens

"We Are Okay," by Nina LaCour is a graphic novel about Marin and her friend Mabel. After leaving her life behind to go to college in New York, Marin must face the truth about the tragedy that happened in the final weeks of summer when Mabel comes to visit.

"Carry On," by Rainbow Rowell is a ghost story, a love story, and a mystery. It has just as much kissing and talking as you'd expect from a Rainbow Rowell story – but far more monsters.

"History Is All You Left Me," by Adam Silvera tells the story of Griffin, who lost his ex-boyfriend, Theo, in a terrible accident. Griffin is piecing his life together in the aftermath, on top of his OCD.

Books for Adults

"Stray City," by Chelsey Johnson is in the queer underground of late 90s Portland. This book explores the complications of belonging – to a city, a culture, and a family – and what happens when those forms can't quite contain who you really are.

"This is How It Always Is," by Laurie Frankel is a novel about revelations, transformations, fairy tales, and family. And it's about the ways this is how it always is: change is always hard and miraculous and hard again. Parenting is always a leap into the unknown with crossed fingers and full hearts. Children grow but not always according to plan. And families with secrets don't get to keep them forever.

"David Bowie Made Me Gay: 100 Years of LGBT Music," by Darryl W. Bullock covers the history of recorded music by and for the LGBT community, and shows how those records influenced the evolution of the music we listen to today.

Look for these books at the Library – and don't forget to watch the Library's Book Cart Drill Team in the Pride Fest Parade on June 16 in downtown Iowa City.

Do you want to use the lowa City Public Library but don't want to deal with the Ped Mall construction? There are apps for that!

The City of Iowa City will complete Phase 1 of their Ped Mall Improvement Project in the fall of 2018, but you don't have to wait till then to access the Library's collections while avoiding construction. We have so many options to entertain your brain from home. All you need is an internet connection, your library card, and password.

The video streaming service called Kanopy is the newest addition to ICPL's suite of digital offerings. Kanopy offers great indie films, documentaries, and -- a staff favorite -- the Criterion Collection. Each library card holder gets 8 play credits per month, and the app is available for multiple devices: iPhones, iPads, Apple TVs, Android phones and tablets, Amazon Fire tablets, Google Chromecast and Roku devices. Get started at icpl.kanopy.com.

Another new offering is digital access to NYTimes.com. ICPL provides a free access code that provides 72 hours of unlimited reading while you are logged in to your personal NYTimes.com account. Never hit a paywall again! This access pass even works on the NYTimes app for smartphones. Find the code at icpl.org/nytimes.

My personal favorite app lets me listen to a book while I get things done. Libby calls itself the "one-tap reading app" and is very intuitive to use. In 2017 alone, I read nearly 70 books through the Libby app. Cooking, cleaning, working out -- none of that stopped me from finishing my book. In fact, all those chores gave me a good excuse to put my book on. (A glass of wine helps with cooking, too.) Find everything available for Libby at icpl.overdrive.com.

Summer is perfect for porch sitting and lazing away. For that I like the RBdigital magazine app. The library subscribes to more than 150 digital magazines on all sorts of subjects -- lifestyle, sports, home improvement and more. *The New Yorker* and *The Economist* are two of our most popular magazines. The RBdigital app is available for Apple, Android, and Kindle Fire devices, or read straight from a computer. Find the full collection at icpl.org/magazines.

Like getting help with research questions or reading recommendations from staff? That's online, too. You can ask us anything at icpl.org/ask. Whether it is local history research, house history research, or whatever else Google is failing you, send us a chat or email to see if we can help at icpl.org/ask.

The Library has also recently launched a new space on the website where you can go to see reading recommendations from the experts. Our Staff Picks page was redesigned so you could see all the excellent books, movies, and music staff is highlighting for your entertainment pleasure. Through My Eyes screening

In 2017, Sujit Singh had an idea. He thought of it as his chance to create something that would start a conversation on disability. Singh envisioned a piece that would help people see a disabled individual not for their disability, but as a person first.

With help from the community, his idea has blossomed into a piece titled *Through My Eyes*, a "disability simulation" documentary that will be premiering at the Iowa City Public Library on June 23 at 3 p.m.

Singh, who has cerebral palsy and epilepsy, has used his experience as the driving force behind his film.

"Throughout my life, I have experienced everything from sympathetic looks, to people telling me they know how it feels, to being bullied because I was different," Singh said.



In *Through My Eyes*, four able-bodied participants volunteered to experience what it is like to be a person with a disability. Participants were paired with a disabled individual and were asked to spend the day dealing with the challenges that those with that particular disability may face. *Through My Eyes* focuses on a person who is blind, a person who has had a traumatic brain injury, a person with a form of mutism and a person who is a quadriplegic.

Each able-bodied participant was interviewed before the simulation to get an idea of what they thought the obstacles may be for their chosen disability. Participants were then interviewed following the experience to see if their preconceived notions had changed. Participants ranged from two current students at the University of Iowa, a state representative and the current ADA coordinator for the City of Iowa City.



"My ultimate wish for this documentary, other than starting the conversation on disability is to have the community recognize that persons with disabilities are capable of doing everything that an abled-bodied individual can do," Singh said. "Their disability doesn't define them, but it makes them the person that they are."

Singh is a University of Iowa alumnus, a production specialist at Public Access Television in Iowa City and an advocate for individuals with disabilities.

Public Access Television not only helped provide the equipment used to create the documentary, they are also a sponsor of the project.

Admission to the Saturday, June 23 screening at the Iowa City Public Library will be free and open to the public.

Iowa libraries take action for Puerto Rico

Local libraries have paired with a library in Puerto Rico to provide relief from September's hurricanes.

In an initiative that is close to the hearts of many, lowa libraries are stepping up to help a community in need.

After Hurricanes Irma and Maria passed through Puerto Rico in September 2017, the island's recovery is taking longer than officials had hoped.

Libraries in Johnson and Linn Counties decided to help as much as they could, knowing how it feels to be in the midst of a disaster.

In 2008, the Iowa and Cedar Rivers flooded, damaging some area libraries, including the Cedar Rapids Public Library and the University of Iowa Main Library and causing the communities to temporarily lose integral institutions.

With this in mind, the area libraries, including in Iowa City, Coralville, and North Liberty, matched with the Francisco Oller Library in Puerto Rico to lend assistance. The action came through an initiative by the American Library Association called Libraries for Puerto Rico, which pairs libraries around the nation with Puerto Rican libraries to raise money to help rebuild them.

The Oller Library is an academic library that is a part of La Escuela de Artes y Diseño de Puerto Rico, the only institution in the territory offering a Bachelor of Fine Arts.

Libraries have been a part of many communities offering free services and keeping their doors open to all.

"We feel bad about it and had to find a tangible way to help," said Kara Logsden, the lowa City Public Library community access services coordinator.

The lowa Library Association received monetary donations to reach its goal of \$15,000 to give to the Puerto Rican library. The Oller has suffered losses of collections because of mold, lack of electricity and air conditioning, infrastructure damage, and much more.

In March, the library began offering its basic services again. The job is not done yet, but officials there hope to be fully operational within the next year. The storm has decreased attendance to library as well with its being shut down.

Many have shown their local support of the initiative.

Jennie Garner, the director at North Liberty Public Library, said, "Patrons come in and said they'd heard about it and were so excited to donate."

The Iowa Library Association has taken many avenues to promote the project, including radio talk shows and posting around the community.

Ellen Alexander, an assistant director at the Coralville Public Library, said, "We do whatever we can do, because libraries are so important to communities' access to resources. Some you can't find anywhere else."

The Iowa City Public Library hopes the funding will not only help to rebuild the libraries' collections, it will also restore the necessary components required to keep the library operating.

Area libraries will accept monetary donations in the form of cash or a check at their front desks through the end of the month.

Johnson County libraries raising money for Puerto Rico

Funds to buy videos, books for library at art school after hurricanes

IOWA CITY — As the 10th anniversary of the 2008 flood nears, Johnson County public libraries are embarking on a mission to help other libraries suffering from a different type of natural disaster — hurricanes Irma and Maria.

Through the month of June, Public Libraries of Johnson County will raise money to replace books, videos and other materials damaged by the storms.

Member libraries, including those in Iowa City, Coralville and North Liberty, will have collection boxes for the fund, according to a release from Iowa City.

"It's just heartbreaking," said Patty McCarthy, director of development at the Iowa City Public Library. "We, having gone through the flood, certainly know what happens and what books look like after they've been through lots of water."

The effort is apart of the Adopt a Library program from the American Library Association and REFORMA, the National Association to Promote Library and Information Services to Latinos and Spanish Speakers. The program paired the Iowa Library Association with Francisco Oller Library in San Juan, Puerto Rico.

Statewide, the goal is to raise \$15,000, McCarthy said.

The Francisco Oller Library is on the campus of Escuela de Artes y Diseño de Puerto Rico, or EAPD, which had about \$2 million in damage. It's the only school in Puerto Rico that offers a bachelor of fine arts degree in majors such as art education, painting and digital art and design, according to the release.

"Libraries in communities can become the place where you go to sign up for help from FEMA or be able to use the internet to be able to tell your family that you're OK," McCarthy said. "Everybody benefits when you have a strong library."

Donations of cash or checks to the Iowa Library Association may be dropped in the donation box. Libraries in Coralville, Iowa City, North Liberty, Oxford, Solon, Springmier and Swisher are participating, according to the release.

#CorridorReads: Libraries join together to share summer reads Agenda Item 5E-6

Partnership is a first across Linn, Johnson county libraries

People across the Corridor are deep in fantasy trilogies, reading "Frankenstein," listening to fiction audiobooks and paging through a cookbook based on the TV show "Gilmore Girls."

That's according to a new social media hashtag — #CorridorReads — that libraries in Linn and Johnson counties began promoting last week.

The campaign is the first time libraries across both counties have developed programming together, said Amber Mussman, Cedar Rapids Public Library community relations manager.

"We've never really had much of an opportunity to do things across the Corridor. This is a great first attempt at that," Mussman said. " ... Even University of Iowa libraries has been joining in on the fun. We wanted it to be as open to everyone as possible."

Participating libraries are encouraging people in the community to post online photos of their favorite reads, their summer book lists or literary events they attend.

"We know that libraries across the Corridor and across the country do all kinds of programming in the summer," Mussman said. "We thought it would be amazing if, instead of focusing on just our summer program, we went a little bigger."

Staff from the Cedar Rapids Public Library and the Iowa City Public Library met first to discuss the campaign idea, she said, before each branched out to other libraries in their respective counties.

Participating libraries include those in North Liberty, Marion, Hiawatha and the University of Iowa Libraries System.

"It's in the early stages, but we're hoping it picks up over the summer," Mussman said. "One of the big goals is to shift focus away from all the negative things out there (on social media), and lighten everyone's spirits."

<u>The #CorridorReads campaign</u> also is promoting additional social media hashtags. On Mondays, it is encouraging social media users to share acts of kindness with the tag #Choose Kindness.

"There's a lot of not-so-fun things out there. Some days it can be a lot," Mussman said. "Think about social media as an opportunity to share about all the good things. ... All of a sudden maybe your Facebook feed is a little brighter that day."
