The Claddagh is one of Ireland's most recognized images — symbolizing the purity of a cherished relationship — friendship (caird-eas), love (grá) and loyalty (dílseacht). We will learn the origins and meaning of the design by reading Celtic folklore, and you can also make your own paper Claddagh from your handprints!

*Kit available for pickup July 21-27.*



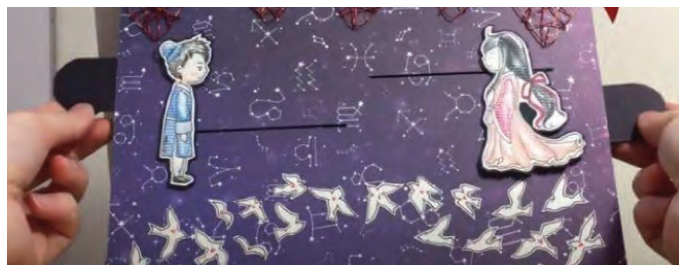

August 4 | 2pm  

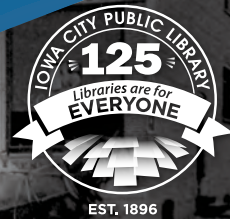

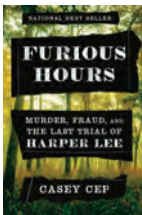
Luis Alberto Urrea writes with compassion, complexity, and humor about the people and places caught up in the border wars.

Saturday, June 19 | 4-5pm

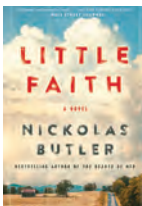

### Let's Talk Books: Own Voices

Tuesday, June 8 | 7-8pm

The term Own Voices (or the hashtag #OwnVoices) describes fiction written by an author from a marginalized or under-represented group writing about their own experiences/from their own perspective.

### Let's Talk Books: Literary Fiction

Tuesday, June 22 | 7-8pm

"Literary Fiction" is the term given to fiction that falls outside traditional genres like mystery, science fiction, or romance because it does not follow a traditional genre formula. Literary fiction explores the human condition, and the effects that actions have on the character(s).

### Let's Talk Books: Short Stories

Tuesday, July 13 | 7-8pm

Short Stories are short works of prose fiction. They may be in any genre, and the exact definition of "short" will often depend on the genre. Short stories are often collected together with other short stories in the same genre, or on the same theme, or by the same author.

### Let's Talk Books: My Favorite Books

Tuesday, July 27 | 7-8pm

This month we will share our favorite books. Books we enjoyed so much that we give them as gifts, lend our copies again and again, or have read them multiple times.

### Let's Talk Books: Humorous Fiction

Humorous fiction is a work of fiction written to amuse the reader. Humor can be subtle or it can be over the top and make you laugh out loud. It can assume many forms - from farce or satire to slapstick, it just depends upon your sense of humor and point of view.
